November Minutes: John Nelson moved to approve the November minutes; motion seconded by Chris Boyd. All present in favor.

- Burro Park (potential training/work trip for interested members); John Nelson said he would proceed with buying the carsonite posts and stickers for Burro Park.
- Thirty-Mile (SJBCH-adopted)
- Treasure Falls
- Continuation of FS sign restoration projects

Volunteer Hours: Donna Fait has compiled the SJBCH 2024 volunteer hours report for state and national BCH.

Old Business:

Ron Toland summarized feedback solicited from members, which included:

- More trail rides (The board is looking for a member to plan and lead efforts for more social activities to include trail rides.)
- List of less demanding trails to ride and clear
- Projects that don't require horses
- Horsemanship mentors
- Better on-boarding

New Business:

Lisa McClure, U.S. Forest Service, retired, and formerly of Trail Wise BCH has offered to assist with chainsaw and crosscut certifications. She also has joined the SJBCH board of directors.
